SMSU RN to BSN Program Curricular Changes

SMSU is pleased to announce the continued success of our RN to BSN Program. The journey from the launch of our nursing program in 2013 until today has been filled with many milestones: 1) acceptance of an ever-increasing number of nursing students 2) successful accreditation by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE) 3) building of community partnerships, 4) engaging faculty who embrace professional values in the context of higher education, and 5) our first nursing graduates.

The support of the students, university, and community has led to continual improvements in the nursing program, including the curriculum. A revised curriculum was approved in the fall of 2015, which creates the following changes to the nursing program.

The updated RN to BSN Course Catalog now includes:



SMSU McFarland Library

SMSU's McFarland Library has several databases that will help you find articles pertaining to research in Nursing. Databases are located in the 'A to Z Database List' link near the bottom of the library homepage (www.smsu.edu/library). Databases that contain health related topics include CINAHL Complete, Health Source: Nursing/Academic Edition, Psychology Journals, and SportDiscus, to list a few. Our online reference book collection is CREDO Reference. If you click the Find a Book tab, a link in the list to the left (under 'All Collections') will take you to Nursing and Allied Health collection of 27 ebooks.

Another helpful tool is also at the bottom of the library homepage: Research Guides. Follow the links from Research guides, to Topic Guides, to Nursing Program (http://libguides.smsu.edu/nursing). Within this guide are pointers for off-campus access, recommended databases, suggested websites, and citation help. Also available—research consultations!
